The two films are shot at various Bay Area locations, some more familiar than others.

Our speaker in February, Virginia McCarthy, served as script supervisor for both of the films. She will share with us what a day on the set of a movie is like, and her experiences working with Hollywood notables Woody Allen and Cate Blanchett (both of whom have been nominated for Academy Awards), She will also reflect on her involvement with *Fruitvale Station's* director/screenwriter (Ryan Coogler) and leading actor (Michael B. Jordan). It's worth mentioning that Coogler is a former student at Saint Mary's College, where Virginia teaches a Jan Term class on the Sundance Film Festival.

The presentation should be a good warm-up for the Academy Awards, to be televised March 2. See you then.
